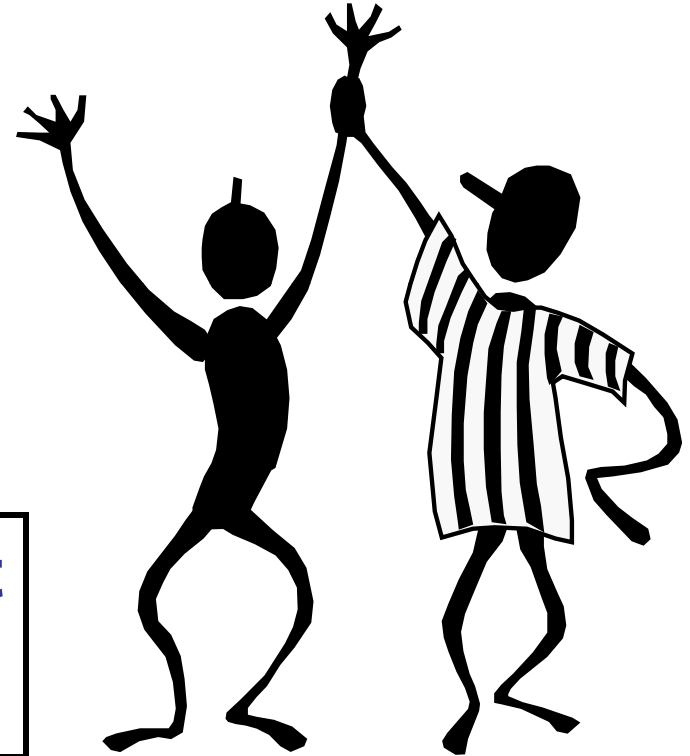
# Bio - Hicks

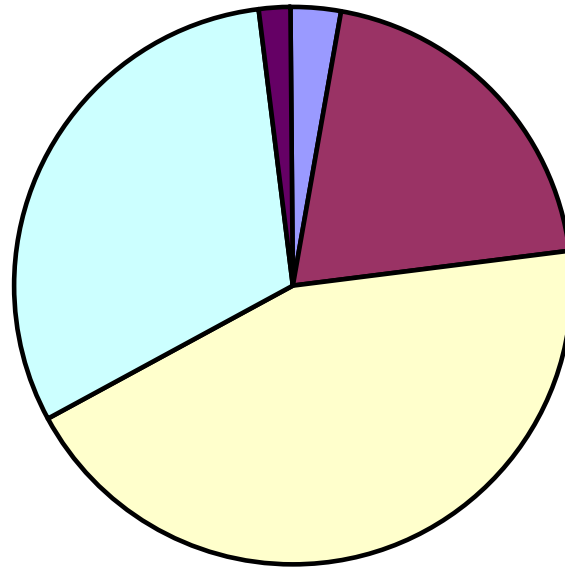
